We have been following the daily meditations and knitting the rows of the pattern set for that day. We shall bring these to the next meeting. But for this meeting, I shared some of the meditations that had been given earlier in the month. These gave a time for personal prayers as well as sharing appropriate hymns.

Our next meeting is on Tuesday April 9th at 2.30pm at East Brent Methodist Church hall when our speaker will be Pastor Jade from Hope Baptist Church. During the service for the World Day of Prayer which was held at her church, she had spoken briefly about her visit to Palestine. This was very apt as the service this year had been written by Palestinian women, and those of us who hear her felt it would be good if she could come and share more of that experience.
