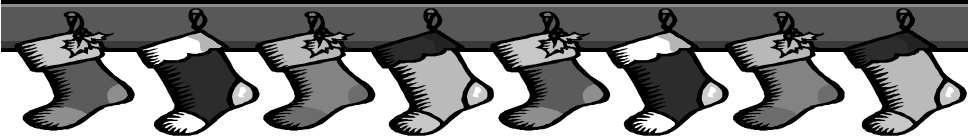

RESPONDING TO THE CRISIS IN LEBANON

As half the Burnham harvest proceeds went to MRDF I thought you might like to know how it is being used.

MRDF is helping to provide humanitarian aid in Lebanon through Action by Churches Together (ACT).

Donations are helping provide food, mattresses and blankets, kitchen utensils and hygiene and sanitation supplies for people who have fled their homes during the bombing.

Hundreds of houses, apartments, shops and other buildings have been severely damaged or destroyed. According to many experts, economy damages and losses go beyond several billion dollars, even without taking into account the consequences of widespread displacement.

Farmers have lost their harvests due to the bombing, which means a loss of their total annual income.

Your support is helping very needy people.

West Huntspill Ecumenical Prayer Group

Let me tell you about one of the Prayer Groups in our village. We meet once a fortnight, just seven of us, (one for each day of the week), not just for prayer, although that is an important part of the evening's activity. The main task is to prepare & update a prayer list to be used by others and ourselves. It includes prayer for the people who live in both East & West Huntspill, street by street; the different churches in both Huntspills & Highbridge and the activities which take place in them week by week; the work of our CMS Missionary link in Pakistan, where she teaches groups of Christian adults. In particular the prayer list includes those whom we know are in special need at that time. On every day of the week at least two people are praying using the list.

In addition to the above we organise two events both of which happen at this time of year. The first is a **Pre-Advent Retreat**. This will take place in the Methodist Chapel on Saturday 2nd December from 2-30pm. to 5.00pm. This will be led by our Superintendent Minister, Revd Terry Young, and will end with the lighting of the Christmas Tree lights.

The other activity is our **Day of Prayer for Christian Unity**. This will also be in the Methodist Church on Saturday 20th January from 10am. to 5.00pm. Half hour sessions throughout the day will be led by members of different denominations and people are welcome to attend one or more sessions as they wish. A light lunch is provided and the day ends with the Communion Service.

We have been glad to see Geoff Tullett back amongst us after his prolonged stay in hospital - Kathleen Burrige is recovering at home after her hip replacement and Bill is at present being cared for in Stratton House - We send special greetings to them and to Iain and Jenny Craig. Ever since their retirement to Somerset Iain has made his own unique contribution to the churches of our Circuit and of West Mendip. He has now had to give up preaching and leading worship but we hope that we shall still be able to benefit from his presence among us for many years to come. It has been good to welcome Peter and Pam Pembro into our congregation while they have taken a "self denying ordinance" from West Mendip for six months following Pam's "retirement". [A very active retirement as you will see from the Plan! and especially welcome during Joyce Plumb's enforced inactivity. We do hope you will be on your feet again soon Joyce.]

In preparation for Christmas the Ecumenical Group will consider an Advent theme on Thursday December 7th at 2.30 pm. We shall not be holding an early December Carol Service this year but it would be good to go to St. Michael's for "Carol Praise" with Harmony Plus Band and the Youth Choir on Saturday December 9th at 7.00pm. [Refreshments from 6.00pm.] We also hope to join in singing "Village Carols" outside/inside the Parish Hall on Wednesday December 20th at 6.30, followed by light refreshments. We shall hold our "Nativity Service" on December 24th at 10.30. am. and a Carol Service on December 31st. On January 7th we take part in the very special service when, according to Methodist tradition, we renew our Covenant with God, who "enfolds us in generous love". It's a very challenging service, but a good start for the new year.

The "Churches Together " Committee met on November 15th and

reminds us of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity from January 18th - 25th. The main event will be the Prayer Day organised by the West Huntspill Churches on Saturday January 20th. from 10.00am- 4.00pm. They have been hosting this for several years and offer us a special opportunity to join others for the day or just for half an hour. Groups for Lent are being planned and details will be published in the New Year.

This weekend [Nov. 17th – 19th] I have been to Sidholme for the Conference organised by M.W.M. [Methodists for World Mission] which met to explore how we can catch the vision and fire of the World Church. The main speaker was Revd. Tom Stuckey, last year's President and the prayers were led by Revd. Ed Standhaft. We also had an excellent presentation from Elizabeth Perry, the Christian Aid Co-ordinator for Dorset and Somerset, who told us about the work with partners in Zambia and spoke passionately of the injustice still endured by the poor peoples of the world – We hope to have a fuller report on the Conference in the next edition of The Link but I just want to put a question which Tom Stuckey posed at the beginning. He said that we should all be asking not "What is the Mission of the Church?" but "What is the Mission of God?" - for us in this place - at this time - We need to be alert for the movement of the Spirit challenging us to be vulnerable and to move on - out of the comfortable place. Let me leave you with two prayers which we used each day:

Morning Prayer. As we rejoice in the gift of this new day, so may the light of your presence, O God, set our hearts on fire with love for you; now and forever. Amen .

Evening Prayer . Give to us and to all your Church, O God a bold vision and a burning charity, a deeper wisdom and a living understanding, that the eternal message of your Son may be acclaimed as the good news of the age; through him who makes all things new, even Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen
