Superintendent's Letter.

As I write this letter Rev Stephen has only been home from hospital 24hours and only 12days since his operation. We are glad that he is making good progress and pray that he continues to gain strength. But I don't want to see him doing any work for at least two to three months. I am grateful for all those who have filled the gaps until the end of February on the Plan, and to those Supernumeraries who are offering pastoral care and support in the Link section of our circuit, as well as the continuing help of the stewards and other officers of the church.

Like many of us I suspect Stephen will want to get back to work as soon as possible, but the temptation to rush back could mean that further down the line we are back to square one and others are left to pick up the pieces. As we approach Advent we can take a lesson from God. This season in the church calendar is a time of preparation for the culmination of God's final plan as we await the Second Coming of Christ. At the end of time the final victory will be won and the scriptures remind us that all things will be made new. Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Jesus reminds us that only the Father knows the time when this will happen. Daphne my wife tells me that I have no patience, it's true. I hate waiting in queues and will go without rather than wait in a shop. I become impatient at the slowness of the church at times, so I share something of Stephens's frustration. If we take a leaf out of God's book we will see that he does not hurry. How long it was before the first coming of Christ that we celebrate at Christmastide, and now two thousand years on we still await his coming again. During this advent season let us ponder on the wonder of God's patience and from it let us try to see that God's timing is perfect.

As we move through Advent and into Christmas let us once again prepare our hearts to receive him, and then unlike me who would take the decorations down on Boxing Day let us savour his presence with us and enjoy relaxing with him. One day Christ will come again in all his glory, until then let us enjoy the moment, for every day can be an advent experience when he comes again in our hearts.

May Daphne and I wish you all a very happy Christmas when it comes.

LINK VILLAGES' FELLOWSHIP

On Tuesday, October 23rd, our Speaker, Mrs Joan Bailley took as her subject "Angels". She spoke of various types of Angels, both good and bad, but she dealt mostly on good angels. She told us of various occasions when people felt that their "angel" was looking after them or was trying to tell them something. This was a thought provoking afternoon when people were left to make up their own minds.

Our Speaker, on Tuesday, November 13^{th,} was Mrs Margaret Edwards - her subject was from "Little London, Leeds to Peshawar, Pakistan". She was Head teacher in a multi cultural school in the centre of Leeds with children from a wide variety of countries from Afro Caribbean to many parts of Asia. When her family had grown up, she decided that she wanted to gain more experience of the Asian culture and applied to the British Embassy School and was given a two year contract. After completing this she decided to stay on and work with the refugees - an experience which she found very rewarding. She showed a series of slides of scenery before going on to show conditions of life there. It was a most interesting afternoon.

The future of Women's Network

Many changes are taking place in Methodism at this time, and one concerns the future of Network.

A consultation document has been produced by the Network Connexional team which seeks to set up a new charitable organisation to cover the kind of issues that Network did.

However this involves an ongoing, major, and at present, unknown cost, which would have to be financed from individuals or from churches. Those to whom I have spoken about this have been very concerned that this kind of organisation would absorb money which they would far rather see go direct to charitable giving.

Up until Monday 12th November, this was the only option which had been presented, without consultation at any wider level. That day I was present at a meeting in Worcester where representatives of Network from the Bristol, Birmingham and Wolverhampton & Shrewsbury Districts were present. We were unanimous in expressing severe reservations about the proposals which had been put before us, and found that we could begin to contemplate "what ifs".

What if there was not a connexional presence as such? Could we survive? What other resources were available that we could tap into?

From this discussion has come a second proposal, drawn up by the Revd. Julie Hulme, which she has circulated to those of us who were present in Worcester. This envisages a far looser structure (tapping into existing organisation such as the World Federation of Methodist and Uniting Church Women,) without the constraints of financing a new organisation. This, to my way of thinking, would be a way to embody the essentials of what I have treasured in Network without losing control of allocating our resources.
