

Our singing was enhanced by us being able to respond to the words of hymns displayed by our new projector out front, rather than being stuck in our hymnbooks, a heart-warming sound appropriate to the occasion.

In January we shall join with Brent Knoll for our annual covenant service at East Brent starting at 10.30 on New Year's Day. Our Joint Service with St Bridget's will be at St B's the following week, 8th; at the early time of 9am. And, on a special note, don't forget Sausages and Beetle Drive at 7pm on Saturday 28th January in our church hall. All welcome but let us know beforehand so that enough sausages can be cooked.

Much as we shall enjoy our Christmas festivities, I am sure that the troubles of this world will not be far from our thought. The violence and sadness of Ukraine will be at the back of our minds; and the shortage of fuel, inflation and the effect of all this on the pockets of those who are most vulnerable in this country and elsewhere contribute to the need for continued efforts to bring justice and peace across the world.

So, without turning too far away from the turmoil of the present time, we hope that you and your families and friends will make the time and capacity to find and enjoy the love that centres our Christmas greeting.

My previous turn to contribute the Stewards' Column for Burnham was at Easter. At that time there were signs that church life was 'picking-up' post-Covid. It is wonderful to report that the trend has continued.

The numbers attending worship have continued to increase. Both longer-term and new-to-the-church folk are joining for worship and for other activities from Bible Study to Baby & Toddlers to Coffee Mornings. At present, on every day of the week, there is at least one church activity — be it a meeting in person or by use of Zoom. We pray that more people will find a welcome and spiritual sustenance within the church. We also pray that some will take on tasks within the activities to enable them to thrive.

A major change over the summer has been the start-up of the Waffle Hub. This community café, which meets in the church premises, is proving popular. It serves drinks together with both savoury and sweet waffles – they are delicious! There is always conversation to be enjoyed. The Waffle Hub is run by volunteers. Many are associated with the Methodist Church while others are associated with the Baptist Church, the Food Bank and other organisations within the town. If they wish, customers may pay a little more than the cost of their food and drink. This enables the Hub to offer the same hospitality to people who might feel themselves to be on the fringes of society. A welcome in a warm place with something to eat can be of great value in the world today.

The last weekend of November, saw the Christmas Fair. The Mayor of Burnham opened the event at 10:00; there was a steady flow of visitors until 1:00 when the last of the lunches were served. Thanks are due to those who worked very hard for the success of the event.

As a means of enhancing our worship, large TV-type screens have recently been installed in the worship area. This not only enables the words of hymns

and songs to be displayed, but also provides additional options for preachers. Two preachers have used clips from feature films to illustrate their messages; others have used short, informative videos and pictures.

As we move through Advent to Christmas, we reflect on God's goodness and the Good News that we have to share in our community at this time.
