




We send you our greeting at Christmas. May God go with us all in peace and wellbeing. And a happy New Year.

This had taken several months to fill in as there were eight pages of questions, but I had the able assistance of Rev. Steve, Liz Bennett and Geoff Stait, who could answers the questions I couldn't. We all learnt a lot about our church building and how we can try to


make it even more Eco friendly. We were awarded the Bronze Certificate at the end of October, and it is now on display in the church. We think that we might try to work towards the Silver award. One way we can be more Eco friendly is to use less paper. So we are trying to send less Christmas Cards. We are going to use a board at the back of the church where you can put a single card and your wishes for people in church. We did this successfully a few years ago. . It saves us buying so many cards, it saves us time writing them but more importantly it saves paper, so we use less trees. Just bring your card and put it on the board.

Our church continues to be a very busy place. The food bank is always busy and is asking for more donations. There is also a Mother and Toddler group held every Friday Morning run by church members. The Waffle Hub is busy and now also houses a Repair Shop and a Clothes Bank on Thursday Mornings. There is a Knit and Natter group that meets every Wednesday afternoon in the church from 2.00 -4.00 p.m. You don't have to be a knitter or be able to sew, you can just come for a chat and a cup of tea or coffee. All are welcome.

We are holding our Christmas Fair on December 2nd from 10.00 a.m.- 2.00 p.m. There will be a variety of stalls including a Christmas Stall and Craft Stalls as well as raffles and refreshments. I am sure you will find it interesting, so please come along.
