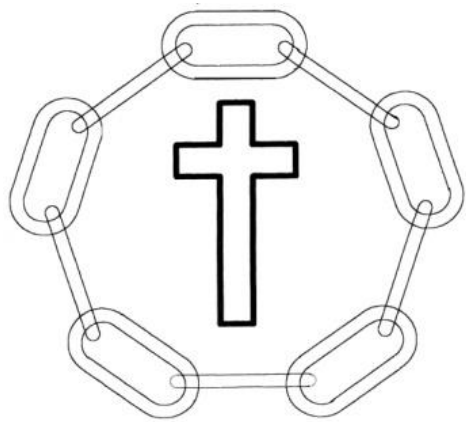

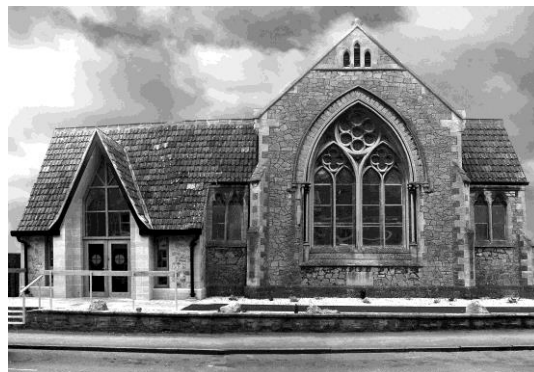

Minister's Letter

Discipleship (being Christ's disciples) in 2017

2017 is now a month old and with the daylight starting to get longer and the return to warmer days, we turn our thoughts to the things we should do together as God's family here in our Methodist Churches. Perhaps these are things that you will be drawn to because of the promises made in the Covenant Service.

Lent Course

Whilst Lent is later this year, and does not start until March, I thought it would be useful to give you details of the Highbridge and Burnham Churches Together Lent Course, so you can get dates in your diary. This year we are using material from 'Christianity Explored' and studying parts of Mark's Gospel. The course is being run in both the afternoons (at Burnham Methodist Church) and evenings (at Burnham Baptist Church) of Tuesdays, commencing on the 7th March.

What does God want us to do this year?

The answer to this question is one that taxes us all as we seek to hear the will of God for our church and our community. One thing is certain, and that is God does not want us to stand still and do nothing. There are many challenges for us in the year ahead as we come to terms with the facts of aging congregations, aging buildings, and the struggle to find people to undertake all the jobs that are so necessary to the successful life of our worshipping community.

But being Christ's disciples means having the faith and the courage to face the questions these issues raise, and to find solutions. There are several places in our Connexion that have already done these things and found that when they step out in this way God is not only alongside them, but has often gone before them. Town and country churches alike have found new ways of engaging with their communities and bringing God's word into the ordinary day-to-day lives of people around them. These initiatives often carry the label 'Fresh Expression', yet they are simply being Christ's disciples in their own places and contexts.

These Fresh Expressions of God's love for others like 'Bread Church', 'Art Church' even a 'Skateboard Church (in Launceston, Cornwall) and many other ways of being together, have been prompted by the Spirit, and encourage people to use their gift and skills in a different way.

I look forward to exploring our discipleship together in 2017.

All of us here at Brent Knoll were sorry to hear of the passing of Margaret Sheldon on 10<sup>th</sup> January. I never had the privilege of meeting Margaret, but on speaking with our own Rev. Margaret Trapp I very much feel that the loss was mine.

Margaret Trapp told me that Margaret Sheldon was an absolute gift to the Methodist Church here in Brent Knoll, being a member for over 40 years before she moved on to Weston. She was our Church Secretary for many years, took part in our Sunday School and helped with teas and coffees in the formative years of the toddler group. And as a keen and gifted gardener, she boosted our wares at our Spring coffee mornings with the wonderful plants that she brought along with her and which she had raised from seed.

As well as being such an integral and well loved member of our church she was also a great friend to Brent Knoll village and took an active role in all aspects of its life - Good Companions, the WI, helping to test the Brownies when they went for their badges and even being in one of the groups who helped collate the Brent Knoll Village News in the good old days when they had to be printed off a duplicator in the vestry in St Michael's Church. Margaret Trapp told me that Margaret Sheldon had a great sense of humour and all those who knew her would remember her with much love and affection. And it goes without saying that our love and our prayers go out to her family at this time.

Early in January, we all met up on a Saturday morning to answer the questions posed in the Circuit review. It was possible for us to do it all together as we are a smaller congregation. The only mistake we made was thinking that a whole morning would be enough! The whole process of responding to the questions posed prompted us to look at the wider purpose of our church and opened some brave discussions. Where are we now? Where are we going? 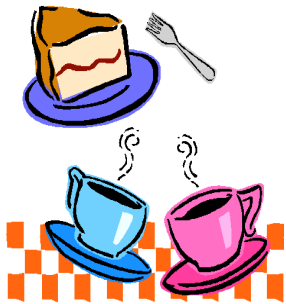
