

#### LINK FELLOWSHIP

On April 8<sup>th</sup> we were pleased to welcome Miss Ruth Burt who told us of work being done in Rwanda to help the widows and orphans after so much genocide in that country. Many of the women were raped and beaten after their husbands had been killed. She showed examples of pictures and cards intricately made using strips of banana leaves. Several of us bought the cards, the monies from which go to provide much needed aid.

As Bridget and Tim Christian were unable to be with us on April  $22^{nd}$ . we arranged a members' afternoon with several giving readings or choosing their favourite Hymn. There was a successful Bring and Buy Stall.

On May 13th, we welcomed Mrs Beryl Griffiths to tell us about the Granny Trek. She and her husband had done many long distance walks over many years - one from John O Groat's to Lands End when her husband was 60 and she was 50 years' old. She decided that they could raise much needed funds for charity. As the Children's Hospice at Barnstaple was being planned, she decided to raise funds for this project. She started planning to do her Granny Trek and gained help from people across the route she was to travel - Lowestoft on the extreme East Coast to St David's Head, Wales - a total of over 500 miles. She set of with her two dogs -Finnish Lapphunds and a friend who was to drive a back up car and take care of domestic arrangements along the way. En route she had arranged to do mini treks and funds were raised by these groups. She raised over £70,000 on this trek which lasted over 6 weeks. To date. she has raised over £137,000 for The Children's Hospice at Little Bridge House, Barnstaple and the new Children's Hospice at Charlton Farm, Wraxall. She still does a Granny Trek in the Spring each year at Charlton Farm. She had brought her dogs with her and they stayed very still but watchful near her. She brought Photos and

at the close passed around her collecting bucket. A very inspiring afternoon.

The next meeting on Tuesday, May 27th. will be the A.G.M. which will be led by Rev Margaret Trapp.

Our Meetings will recommence in September when we shall be pleased to see anyone who would like to join us for an afternoon of fellowship and cup of tea.

### **HARRY'S Cuttings**

#### THE LORD IS THE JUDGE OF OUR MOTIVES:

Solomon said, 'We may think we know what is right, but the Lord is the judge of our motives.' Writer Isabel Wolseley says, 'I'm a placid, get-along-with-everybody person. But that changed when my friend and 1 had a disagreement. I told her I was right, and why, and others commended me for having been right. The trouble is, I didn't feel any better...I felt worse. "Lord," I prayed, "You know I was right, so why do I feel so terrible?" I stewed for several days then I sensed His answer: "Yes, you were right, but your attitude was wrong!" I won a little victory in a difference of opinion, but I'd lost in the realm of friendship. I asked my friend to forgive me. She did, and our relationship was restored. This happened several years ago, and know what? I can't even remember what the argument was about. It seemed so allabsorbing at the time. Not now.'

Don't let your need to 'always be right' rob you of opportunities to show grace and allow God to deal with others. To the hard-headed amongst us James writes, 'Be quick to hear [and] slow to speak' (James 1:19 NRSV). You must earn the right to *speak* into someone's life, and that takes time. It also means trying to *understand* what they're going through; otherwise they'll tune you out. Ask yourself, 'What's my goal? To win the argument? To look good and sound smart?' That's a guaranteed formula for damaging relationships. Paul writes, 'Let the Spirit renew your thoughts and attitudes' (Ephesians4:23 NLT). Bottom line: when you pay attention to the Holy Spirit He will tell you when you need an attitude adjustment.

Before entering the broadcasting field, Jim Valvano led the North Carolina State University basketball team to a national championship. Then cancer developed in his lower back. Invited to address the Duke University squad, Jim had this to say "Life changes when you least expect it to. The future is uncertain. So, seize this day, seize this moment, and make the most of it

God gives us an urgent directive in Hebrews 3:13, "Exhort one another daily while it is called –'Today' lest any of you be hardened through the deceitfulness of sin." Why is there such a strong insistence on *today*?

It may be that *today*, this very day could be the last one in our time here on earth Today may be your last opportunity to accept God's gift of salvation, or if you know the Lord already, to share His love with a friend or loved one.

James has this warning about presuming upon our tomorrows: "You do not know what will happen tomorrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away" (4:14). Seize the opportunities that God gives you today. That's sound advice--not just for basketball players, but for all of us.
