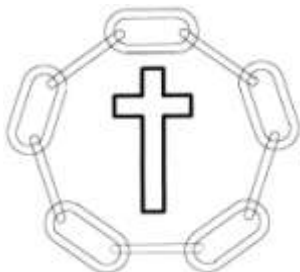

Minister's Letter

Do you sometimes have days when your best laid plans don't quite come off? Yesterday's day off was one of those: I had intended to mow the lawns front and back – all that rain has made them spring up and while they look quite pretty with all the buttercups and daisies I know they need to be cut now or the job will be much harder in another week or two.

All was going well - I got as far as getting out the mower and plugging in the extension lead and then went to the drawer in the garage where I keep my gardening gloves. They were nearly new gloves and I'm sure they were in very good condition last time I used them a few weeks ago but now all I found was a pile of fluffy cotton!

Further investigation discovered that Julie's new bag of bird food had developed a hole and that there were now large piles of bird food in each corner of the garage. I also noticed the tell tale little black droppings that told the story – we had mice!

So instead of mowing the lawn the rest of the morning was spent pulling out all the boxes and drawers from the garage and cleaning them out. At least it gave me a chance to clear out some junk!

Reports from the Representative Session of the Bristol District Spring Synod Nailsea Methodist Church, Nailsea 21st April 2012

The **Representative session of Bristol District's Spring Synod** was held on 21st April 2012 at Nailsea Methodist Church under Gordano Valley Circuit. It started by the worship lead by three probationer Ordinands for this connexional year at the Methodist Conference at Plymouth, Rev Sharon Lovelock, Rev Andrew Portage and Rev Denise Yeadon, with their inspiring testimonies and call to the ministry. Rev Rachel Borgars has organised the singing from 'Singing in Faith' Hymns book.

Rev Carrie Seaton (Synod Secretary) moved a motion to appoint Rev David Alderman (Deputy Chair) as 'Acting Chair' due to Rev Ward A Jones (Dist Chair) was on Sabbatical. Synod agreed to appoint Rev David Alderman as an Acting chair.

The whole Agenda was based upon the aspects of on a Theme, "Proclaiming the Faith" under various heading divided into two sessions with a lunch break.

Confessing Faith: Rev David Alderman thanked the ordinands and officially welcomed the Synod and asked the host Circuit to welcome and share the practicalities Synod were welcomed by the Superintendents of the Gordano Valley Circuit, Rev Dr Russel G Herbert. Synod has been asked their permission to grant dispensation who has requested. The letter of Greetings has been notified. A special note of greetings has been agreed to be sent to Her Majesty the Queen for celebrating her Diamond Jubilee being Queen of UK. Rev Carrie Seaton has also notified some alteration in the agenda and it was amended and agreed. A memorial has been agreed to be sent from the North East Somerset and Bath circuit to the Conference concerning levy on the Model Trust Fund. Offering agreed to support 'Phakamisa' Project and 'Willows Counselling'. She has also mentioned what she received from Rev Mandy Stevens that we are delighted to tell Martin Blokeman and Wendy Tucker has been accepted for Presbyteral Training. Finally notified by Andrew Owens regarding the Local Preachers day of the Evangelical revival on 23rd May 2012. The Scrutineers appointed as it was mentioned in the Synod Agenda. Voting papers for the Synod has been distributed to the seats with the correction notified that it was not the Circuit but should be read as 'Synod' to be used for voting in favour of to be approved / disapproved for the Differed Resolution from Clause 4 of the Deed of Union from the last Methodist Conference.

Celebrating Faith: Good news and the stories from the Circuits has been shared by Gwyn, Carrie and Dave Chandler has been invited to share the stories happening in their circuit in this slot re the 'hand written Bible', 'Food Banks' and 'Sheep Hunt'.

Resourcing the Faith: The Rev Andrew Prout brought the matter from the District Policy Committee but firstly he invited Rev Dr. Peter Hatton to share event happening in the New Room of the Bristol district which gives opportunity to us to resource the faith.

Then he shared the concern from the DPC is in need to get one minutes Secretary as Margaret Naish has stepped down last year. Synod also is asked to agree to the closure of the Tinhead Methodist Church in the Wiltshire United Area due to the society moved out to a local Anglican Church several years ago. Also seek approval to bringing of the sharing agreement for St Martins and St Marks Church and for Church Cottage in the Parish.

Voting for Deferred Resolution of the Deed of Union Clause 4 of the Methodist Conference has taken place by voting on Ballot. Result came later by the scrutineer was 102 – Approved and 6 Disapproved.

Rev John Emmett explained and presented some of the features of the District's new Website.

Rev Rachel Borger advertised re the 'Bridging the Gap' and presented the event and it's purpose on DVD. This event is going to take place on Sat 16th Jun 2012 at Nailsea Methodist Church, Nailsea, under Gordano Valley Circuit of the District.

Mr Robert Beckham (Dist. Treasurer) presented the Finance statement of the District with recommendation to appoint HWCA Bristol as Chartered Accountant for this year. Also aware that by next year the Connexional assessment is expected to increase by 7%.

Reaching Out in Faith: A very nice presentation and display were made by Mike Fishers from 'Willows Counselling' at Swindon working internationally and 'Phakamisa Project' at South Africa for the needy young children and their parents to provide the educare was presented by Glenda. The retiring collection has been split into these two projects. Synod Break for Lunch.

After Lunch, Andrew Prout put forward from the DPC for the adoption of the Mission Statement which Synod adopted as a practical way forwarded to the District Policy committee. The authorization of the persons named other than the Minister to celebrate the Holy Communion which Synod agreed. Change of the new name of the District has been notified to Synod subject to approval of the Conference and after that transferring all the legal document of the Bristol District in the new name of the district.

Enjoying the Faith: Emma Mills, newly appointed District Youth work enabler, enthused the house by her team presentation re the Youth work in Bristol district.

Developing Faith: Synod break into groups and discussed, 'what inspired us today that we will share with our Circuit and what new ways of proclaiming the faith will we expect.

Sending Out in Faith:

As part of the closing administration, Synod appointed Rev David Alderman to continue as 'Acting Chair' until Ward's return from Sabbatical (with the exception of the days when Ward will be at conference). After closing administration and courtesies it was concluded by the 'closing worship', by using the resources from 'More than Gold', "An act of Praise".

The Old Windmill

READ

Galations 6:6-10

He who believes in me as the scripture has said, out of his heart will flow rivers of living water. --John 7:38

A man who grew up on a farm in West Texas tells about a rickety, old windmill that stood alongside his family's barn and pumped water to their place. It was the only source of water for miles.

In a strong wind the windmill worked well, but in a light breeze it wouldn't turn. It required manually turning the vane until the fan faced directly into the wind. Only when properly positioned did the windmill supply water to the farm.

I think of that story when I meet with leaders from small churches in remote areas. Many feel isolated and unsupported--giving care while no one seems to care for them. As a consequence, they grow weary and struggle to bring life giving water to their stock. I like to tell them about the old windmill and our need to daily reposition ourselves --to intentionally turn toward the Lord and His Word and to drink deeply from Him who is the source of living water.

What's true for church leaders is true for all. Service for God flows from within, outward. Jesus said, "He who believes in Me,...out of his heart will flow rivers of living water" (John7:38).It's when God speaks to our depths that we are able to touch the lives of others. To refresh others, let's return to the Source of life regularly. --DavidRoper

HERES a sad statistic Over 50 of those who enter the ministry leave it within ten years because of discouragement Make sure that doesn't happen to your pastor. Picture this: Joshua's soldiers are down in the valley fighting the Amaleldtes. Above him on a hill top sits Moses with his hands raised toward heaven. As long as his arms are raised the battle

goes their way. But if you've ever tried to hold your hands up for long, you quickly grow weary and lower them. The moment Moses does that, the battle goes against Israel. So Aaron and Hur hold up his arms and the tide turns in favour of Israel, it wasn't just Joshua's ability to fight, it was Moses' ability to hold up his arms that won the day. Aaron and Hur kept a leader from fainting so an entire nation could be saved. God said, 'I will give you shepherds according to my heart who will feed you with knowledge and understanding' If God has given you a pastor who loves, leads and feeds you. Support them. Hold up their hands! In the Old Testament tabernacle the candlesticks had to be kept burning day and night because their Light represented God's presence among His people. If a light so much as flickered, designated servants moved in immediately to refuel it and restore it to its original glow. Are you getting the idea? It's your responsibility to make sure the light doesn't flicker in your church or the fire go out in your pulpit. So pray for your pastor every day. And be sure to encourage him every chance you get
