Minister's Letter

Dear friends,

Where ever you were on Easter morning I hope and pray the sun was shining. Over the last week I have discovered that in my close group of friends I wasn't the only one to receive a text message at 5.20am Easter morning. It read "He is Risen. Alleluia."

Universally it is a message unlike any other. The Church's proclamation is unique and at every opportunity we able are commissioned to proclaim that God's own Son died and then rose again after being pronounced dead and is now alive for eternity. This is so significant that no other world religion comes close.

Over the next few weeks in our services we begin to see how the early church takes on board the news and how their experience is changed by the presence of the risen Christ and the Holy Spirit.

What a difference those disciples made. It has been estimated that in that first century the church in Jerusalem numbered about 150. In our terms that means two Burnham sized churches. It was not a church made up of young people but with a mixture of ages and different experiences. Some having a stronger faith than others. One thing they had in abundance that we sometimes need to be reminded of and that is a passion for mission.

During the month of May not only do we celebrate Christ's Ascension and Pentecost but as Methodists, May 24th 1738 was the conversion of John Wesley when he felt "his heart strangely warmed." Wesley was instrumental in the English Revival changing thousands of lives. What a vision God gave him. "The world is his Parish". Shouldn't we all consider and pray about the vision God has for us. By the prompting of the Holy Spirit we will find our faith and mission rekindled for Him and Him alone.

LINK VILLAGES' FELLOWSHIP

Members were very interested to hear the story of the development of Yeo Valley Dairies. The farmers, Mr and Mrs Mead decided to branch out into the yoghurt making business several years ago. Everything is organic - the cattle are fed organically, as are the sheep and chickens. The wool is used for making jumpers; the meat is used in the canteen; the chickens' eggs and meat are also used in the canteen.

There are now several farms supplying milk for yoghurt production and four centres where different processes take place including the production and distribution. A new building is soon to be opened at Highbridge. At the close of a very interesting Video Presentation, there was a supply of free yoghurts and mousse for everyone.

On Tuesday, April 14th, we held our annual Members' Afternoon which was led by Evelyn Tucker. Members gave a selection of readings - some connected with Easter. It was an enjoyable afternoon. The Bring and Buy stall was well supported - the proceeds from which are to go to the Network District Project.


