

The month of May is upon us. Easter is past though we still have another couple of weeks in which to make the most of the Easter season. And perhaps to look back at what we have experienced and learned in the process.

To paraphrase Danish philosopher Søren Kierkegaard (1813–1855), "Life must be lived forward, but it can only be understood backward." I saw that phrase in a commentary on Jonah and the whale. Jonah knew what God was doing, and how God does it, and how right God is—but only after emerging from the belly of the whale.

I suppose we shall understand all the discombobulating things that are happening these days, sometime in the future. But we still have to live with it all in the immediate days ahead and rely on our sense of values and the love that arises from them, in doing so.

It has been a good month here at Brean. Palm Sunday saw Michael Pullan taking our service. Previuosly he was a minister in our Circuit but now he is a supernumerary and lives to the north of us, so it was good to renew acquaintance. Kathy, in spite of her bad leg, shamed us all by joining Steve for the sunrise service on top of Brean Down on Easter Day. Our 10.30 service saw John T and Stanley share worship and communion.
