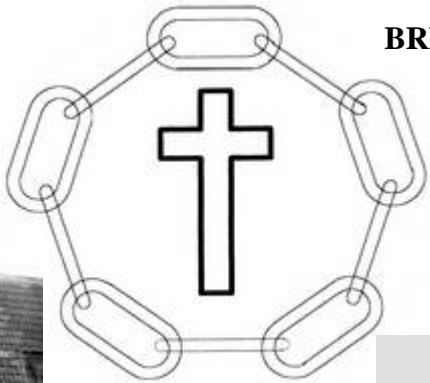

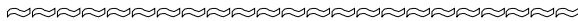


MRDF SUPPORTERS NEW APPEAL FOR ZIMBABWE

A ban barring aid agencies from operating in Zimbabwe has now been lifted. MRDF is supporting a new appeal that will deliver food and agricultural assistance to some of the country's most vulnerable people. It is estimated that nearly 4 million people could go hungry in October with this number peaking at 5 million between January and March 2009. Now that the ban has been lifted, many will now be able to access much-needed food supplies. MRDF is supporting an appeal through Action by Churches Together that will distribute monthly food rations of maize, cooking oil and beans to over 26,000 people in some of the most vulnerable communities. It will also help farmers rebuild their livelihoods by providing seeds, fertilisers and training in conservation farming that will help them mitigate the impact of drought on their crops

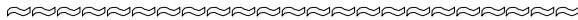
