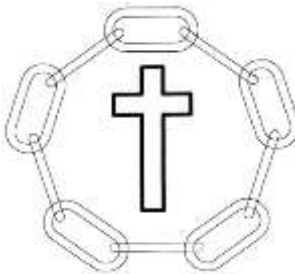

You do not have to be an IT wizard to at least just look at what your children/young people are writing on their 'public wall'; what is written can be viewed by many many people worldwide and often it is information or comments you would not expect or want your child to say out loud in the supermarket. For my own part I discovered my son had detailed his name, address and then announced when we were all off to France!

The above shows just a small part of the work with our young people; of course we also have others in the church involved in ministry, stewardship, property, music, flowers, refreshments and finance which make up the whole picture.

It was lovely to see so many people support Ruth Knott and her family at the services for Bert, he will be sadly missed.

On Saturday 19th September the youth groups and members from the congregation shared the experience of Nutty Noah, a magician who kept us all amused and intrigued for an hour. It was wonderful to watch the 'grown ups' and children enjoy themselves together.

We have our council meeting on Saturday 3rd October which will, if as it usually is, be productive for our church.

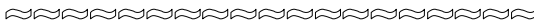
