

Hello to everyone,

We are the new ministers who will begin serving in the circuit from September 1st. We look forward to meeting you all and working with you. Hopefully it won't take too long to remember names. You will need to keep reminding us for the time being. In this first letter, we thought we would introduce ourselves.

I am Deacon Gary Hoare. I have been a deacon since September 1995, this is my 20th year of service. In 2017 I will be celebrating 20 years Ordination as a deacon in the Methodist Church. I have served in Bromley in Kent, Rochdale in Lancashire, Bristol, Telford and most recently Yeovil and Blackmore Vale Circuits. Before this I worked as a Lay Worker for eight years and worked as a nurse and care assistant before that. My mum lives in Plymouth and she will be celebrating 89 years. My interests are music, especially organ music and piano; swimming; I like art and taking photographs and spending time with my family.

Last year (2014) I had a three month sabbatical. In that time I worked with the Healing on the Streets known as HOTs, team on the streets of Bath. I spent many Tuesdays and Thursday out praying with people on the streets and people were blessed through the ministry they received. I have always felt passionate about Mission and Evangelism and praying with people. During this time many things happened, including me feeling really blessed by what has happening. I look forward to sharing with you very soon and praying with you. Please ask if you would like a prayer, I would be very pleased to do so.

And I am Revd Angie Hoare. I have been a minister since 2002 and I have served in Manchester and Bristol. Before that I was a secondary Maths teacher and then I worked for a while in Council Tax and Housing Benefit and was an advisor for the Citizens Advice Bureau. I have always been a part of the Methodist Church and served in various roles as a lay person. I was accredited as a local preacher in 1982. I have a heart for social justice and for deepening discipleship in the life of the church.

Family is also important to me. We have a daughter and two sons – all adults now – and two granddaughters and a grandson, so family gatherings are lively! Our middle son will probably move with us to Weston, but may not stay long. He is keen to get his own place and I think will be back in Bristol as soon as he can. My sister, who lives in Kent where I was born, will also visit from time to time.

We are very excited about joining you all, and pray that God will bless the time we spend together.

HARRY'S Readings LOVE COVERS A MULTITUDE OF SINS! 1 Peter 4:8 NLT

A PERSON'S sense of self-worth is often based on the reactions, positive or negative, of those around them. So your words and attitudes can literally build them up or tear them down. Dr. Paul Brand was a flight surgeon during World War 11. He tells in one of his books of a man named Peter Foster, who was a Royal Air Force pilot Foster flew a Hurricane, which was a fighter plane with a design flaw. the single-propeller engine was mounted in the front, and the fuel lines ran past the cockpit. In a direct hit, the pilot would instantly be engulfed in flames before he could eject. The consequences were often tragic. Some RAF pilots caught in that inferno would undergo ten or twenty surgeries to reconstruct their faces. Peter Foster was one of those downed pilots whose face was burned beyond recognition. But Foster had the support of his family and the love of his fiancé. She assured him that nothing had changed except a few millimeters of skin. Two years later they were married. Foster said of his wife, 'She became my mirror. She gave me a new image of myself. When I look at her, she gives me a warm, loving smile that tells me I'm okay.' Your marriage, and other valued relationships in your life, ought to work that same way too-even when disfigurement has other's self-esteem, and overlooks flaws that could otherwise be destructive. There's a biblical word for this kind of commitment: it's called love.

Transformed Hearts

During the **early 1970s** in Ghana, a poster titled "The Heart of Man" appeared on walls and public notice boards. In one picture, all kinds of reptiles—symbols of the vile and despicable—filled the heart-shaped painting with the head of a very unhappy man on top of it. In another image, the heart-shape was clean and serene with the head of a contented man. The caption beneath the images read: "What is the condition of your heart?"

In Matthew 15: 18-19, Jesus explained what pollutes a person. "The things that come out of a person's mouth come from, the heart, and these defile them. For out of the heart came evil

Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it. Proverbs 4:23

thoughts—murder, adultery, sexual immorality, theft, false testimony, slander" (Niv). That is the condition of a heart separated from God—the situation ancient Israelites found themselves in when their sins forced them into exile (EZEK 36:23).

God's promise in Ezekiel 36:26 is beautiful: "I will give you a new heart, and I will put a new spirit in you. I will take out your stony, stubborn heart and give you a tender, responsive heart" (NLT; SEE ALSO 11:19). God will take away our stubborn hearts that have been corrupted by all kinds of evil and give to us a clean heart that is responsive to Him. Praise God for such a wonderful gift.

Father in heaven, thank You that when we confess our sin to You, You give us a new heart and a new life. I pray that the life I live reflects the goodness of Your gift and that others may see the difference a new heart has made in me.

For a new start ask God for a new heart.
