

## Minister Letter Starting Again?

Welcome to September, the start of the new Methodist Church Year! I am sure that 2016/17 will be a challenging and exciting year for us. There are new things for us to do and to support, there are decisions to be made, and there is of course the continuation of our work and witness in this area.

The word of God is all about renewal and rebirth. John's Gospel records that Jesus told Nicodemus that he had to be born again in order to be able to see the kingdom of God, and in the book of Acts Saul needed to be transformed on the road to Damascus to be the Paul of the early church. In the same way we need to be transformed and transformational in the way we proclaim that God is here in this time and place, and how we demonstrate this in our lives.

There are many practical matters that will fill up our Church Council agendas, Burnham should hear whether or not it can proceed with the replacement of its roof, or indeed whether there needs to be a complete rethink of what it should do (your continued prayers would be appreciated), our property and finance returns will need to be done, our health & safety and safeguarding policies will need to be reviewed, the things we are going to do at Christmas and the New Year will need to be decided. But surely if our joint proclamation and personal demonstration of Jesus' teachings are excluded from our discussions then we are not the Church that Christ taught us to be.

As a church this means focussing on our communities, as individuals it means focussing on our relationships and the way we interact with each other, as followers of Christ it means....evidencing renewal and rebirth to the world.

2015/16 has been a wonderful year of fellowship together and I thank you all for your continued support, encouragement and prayers. Yet the one thing that we know for sure is that nothing remains static, and change is as much part of the church life as our own. The 'constant' remains the presence of God and his transforming grace for us all.
